ADEPT membership fee categories and costs

Local authority fees

For a new authority, membership costs £450 for the first year. From then on, fees are based on the population of the authority:

- Population under 250,000 £500 per annum
- Population between 250,000-500,000 £1000 per annum
- Population over 500,000 £1700 per annum

Each Place Director can nominate up to 6 named individuals who become ADEPT members.

Associate membership

Local Enterprise Partnership chief executives are eligible for membership at a cost of £175 per annum.

Honorary Members

To be eligible as an honorary member, you must be retired from relevant remunerated employment.

Special Honorary Members who retire from relevant employment within the private sector will be eligible for transfer to the class of Honorary Member.

Honorary membership is FREE.

Special Honorary Members

A special honorary member is someone who was previously a member or honorary member who now works:

- within the private sector
- outside of local government in the public sector

Special honorary membership is £25 per annum.
