Key	<ul> <li>Despite significant pressures on council budgets ADEPT now has 98 local authority members, which is approximately 80% of the authorities outside of London. We also have a committed cohort of corporate partners, some of whom are now co-delivering elements of our work programme.</li> <li>Events continue to attract excellent numbers of delegates and sponsorship.</li> <li>The Leadership Development Programme is now in its 6<sup>th</sup> year, and more than 150 participants have now completed the programme.</li> <li>We are launching a Leadership Pathway Programme for middle managers, which will commence in the autumn.</li> <li>The PACE thought leadership programme, sponsored by Amey, is highly lauded by those place directors who have participated, plus it's producing some excellent resources.</li> <li>The ADEPT manifesto asks were published in Autumn 2023, and we are developing a public affairs strategy that will help us to</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>engage with Westminster more effectively.</li> <li>There are now regional boards across the country and a Climate Change Board.</li> <li>We regularly meet with the other professional local government bodies (ADASS, ADCS, ADPH) and the CEO of the LGA – these meetings continue to be positive.</li> <li>We have regular engagement with key departments – our relationships with Defra, DfT, DESNZ continue to be good and engagement with DLUHC is improving.</li> <li>A growing area of work has been workforce issues, which we've been developing in partnership with Colas – we've produced a staff retention toolkit, ED&amp;I campaign, and there is a Gen Z recruitment campaign pilot underway.</li> <li>Live Labs 2 – we held an Expo in April, all the projects are well underway and we are starting some behavioural insights work.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Excellent sponsorship of the Spring &amp; Autumn Conferences, membership growth and new commercial partnerships</li> <li>Less expenditure on staff costs, and subject board &amp; officer costs.</li> <li>We have just over £300k in reserves – this money is split across a number of high interest savings accounts.</li> <li>The budget for 2024/25 shows increased surplus due to additional income streams, whilst keeping costs to a minimum.</li> <li>This creates a solid strategy that will enable ADEPT to continue in the longer term and maintain the financial sustainability of the organisation.</li> </ul>
