Excellence in Place Leadership Programme

Creating an environment for change demands fresh thinking

As part of our commitment to driving innovation, ADEPT is launching its second *Excellence in Place Leadership* programme, in partnership with Amey.

We want to bring together forward-thinking 'thought leaders' from across ADEPT to examine the key issues and opportunities affecting our sector.

Together, we will create a forum to:

- Shape the way ADEPT members do business
- Create an environment for change
- Catalyse fresh thinking
- Influence strategy across place

Commencing in early 2021, there will be four one-day sessions over a 12-month period, hosted by an independent facilitator:

- **22 January 2021**
- **26 March 2021**
- **11 June 2021**
- **10 September 2021**

We want to create an enduring, self-sustaining and inclusive professional network of thought leaders and influencers, so we are looking for a diverse and inspiring group of 10-12 people who can, and will, make a difference.

The 2019/2020 cohort covered the following topics:

- Innovation in procurement
- Making green finance work
- Delivering customer-centric place services
- Leadership in a climate emergency

Outputs from these sessions included a thought piece on a place-based approach to public procurement and the publication of our Green Finance toolkit.

Typically each session includes keynote thought leaders, structured discussions and activities to create thought pieces, policy proposals, blogs and articles that can be shared with a wide range of audiences to challenge and stimulate conversation.

We will hold a preliminary briefing with the programme team and new cohort before Christmas 2020 to decide the first topic for the 2021 programme. Topics for future sessions will be agreed and developed via an organic process by agreement within the group.

Application Process

- Exclusive to ADEPT members
- Participants need to commit to the full 12-month programme
- Participation is free (but does not include travel or subsistence costs)
- Focused on director level officers, we will also consider emerging ‘place’ leaders, as part of a pathway leadership development programme or thought leaders in their field. We will also consider thought leaders who are not necessarily working at director level within their organisation.
- Expressions of interest should be submitted using the form available on the ADEPT website no later than Friday 27 November.
