Cumbria's Strengths

- > Nationally significant in nuclear civil and defence:
 - World leading nuclear reprocessing and decommissioning expertise
 - Nuclear licensed sites available for new build
 - > Astute and Dreadnought submarine programmes
- World's largest offshore wind farm in Barrow and supporting manufacturing supply chain
- High concentration of advanced engineering and manufacturing firms exporting globally

- Critical to UK's food supply major supplier of meat and dairy
- Water meet North West's needs

- Excellent apprenticeship performance




The productivity challenge



- Productivity 11% to13% below UK average
- Improving recently particularly in West
 Cumbria (4% below – East Cumbria 19% below)
- A third due to economic structure remainder due to performance
- Per job West Cumbrid

Key Challenges 2 - 6

- 2. Thin pool of higher level skills compounded by geography 3rd smallest population, 8th largest geography
- 3. Pockets of worklessness cheek by jowl with high paid employment
- 4. Lower levels of business starts up 40% below the national average
- **5.** Fewer fast growing firms in absolute and relative terms
- 6. Innovation patchy performance in area with world leading innovation




